MABS is the operative word for mid-April. Did you send in your reservation form? If not...

**ISAO OMACHI (Japan)** is our guest artist from the Far East. He studied as an apprentice with *Mr. Takeo Kawabe* for five years starting in 1992. In September of 1999 he became a member of the prestigious Japan Bonsai Kyodo Kumiai. Seven years later, the Japan Bonsai Association certified *Mr. Omachi* as an instructor. Within three months, he won the coveted Prime Minister's Award at the 32nd Sakufu-Ten Bonsai Exhibition.

His first appearance at MABS was also in 2006 when he came the assistant to *Mr. Shinji Suzuki*. He so impressed the attendees that we invited him back as a headliner in 2009. As part of his professional activities he travels to Korea every year to maintain the spectacular Sumsund Bonsai Collection. In March of 2011, *Mr. Omachi's* home and nursery were swept away by the tsunami which struck his home in Sendai, Japan. While his family is safe, he lost his entire collection.

He, again, will share his deep and stimulating understanding of bonsai. *Ms. Hideko Metaxas* has expanded the honor by consenting to translate. For the last 2 issues you have read the background of Chase Rosade, one of the early Americans to bring the art of bonsai to the States, and John Thompson (JT), an outstanding member of the California artists.

You can talk with them all weekend, take a workshop on Sunday afternoon, and go through the Members Exhibit at a critique. On your own, visit the 2nd Annual Professional International Exhibit as well as the Members Exhibit for eye candy. Thin your wallet with the vendors; take home a prize demo tree should you win a raffle; find needed containers, trees, tools, and other items at the banquet/auction; Talk bonsai with old and new friends. And if you can find the time, have a dip in the pool. Your family can spend time at Hershey Park.

There are still openings for participants in the ABS/Joshua Roth New Talent Contest (all day Friday). You may be in bonsai from 1-10 years and submit photos of your work to Pauline Muth, <a href="mailto:pauline@pfmbonsai.com">pauline@pfmbonsai.com</a>. A large plus for YK members (and spouse) is ½ price for full registration if this is the first time you are coming to a MABS FESTIVAL — it is on the registration form. Small plus if you're driving: gas is at least 50cents/gallon less in New Jersey and somewhat less in Pennsylvania.

The Yama Ki Officers and Board of Directors would like the upcoming bonsai display at the Stamford Museum and Nature Center to include trees belonging to as many club members as possible.

We know you love your trees; we know you take pride in the work you have done on them, even if it is not even close to being finished. Please give others the opportunity to appreciate and enjoy your trees as well, by offering **at least one** of your bonsai for display during our upcoming Arbor Day weekend event at the Stamford Museum (on High Ridge Road near Bartlett Arboretum).

# Yes, this means we want your trees too!

Your trees do not have to be award-winners. They do not have to be "finished." They can be at early stages of bonsai development, even in mica or plastic bonsai pots. Every tree, even the humblest, will be part of the learning and enjoying experience of museum-goers who view our club's bonsai display. Most of the audience will be local residents, and therefore potential new members of Yama Ki.

Please don't be shy! This is not going to be a juried show, and our audience (500-1000 over the course of the weekend) will not be bonsai experts. Many of us have found, at previous public displays, that the humbler, newer trees are often the ones that catch the notice and earn the appreciation of the general public.

Mike Pollock has offered to host a pre-show workshop to help members prepare their trees for display, including clean-up, mossing, wiring/unwiring, and finding, making or borrowing an appropriate display stand or slab and an accent or companion plant.

We expect to have space for 50 to 60 trees, possibly more, at the Stamford Museum, so literally every club member could have a tree in this show. The display area will be indoors, so your trees will be safe. Please email a jpeg of whatever trees you would like to display to Mike Pollock (mikepollock@me.com). We will consider as many trees as you would like to offer.
