David DeGroot, curator of the famous Pacific Rim Collection, will be visiting the east coast in September and we were able to reserve a date in his busy itinerary. The only date available to us was Monday, September 22nd. Rather than miss this opportunity, we have scheduled that evening for him to be our guest artist. His topic will be “Azalea Design and Refinement” including a demonstration on a carefully chosen Azalea, specially flown in from the El Dorado Nurseries in California.

Since 1989, David has been the curator of the Pacific Rim Bonsai Collection of the Weyerhaeuser Company near Seattle, Washington. He began his bonsai adventures in 1972 when he started studying and practicing bonsai. He has authored numerous articles about bonsai which have been published in at least seven countries. His writing earned Bonsai Clubs International’s “Outstanding Writer, Artist and Photographer” Award. American Bonsai Clubs, on whose Board he has served, published his booklet BASIC BONSAI DESIGN which is a compilation of a series of his articles.

BONSAI PESTICIDE DILUTION & APPLICATION INFORMATION

“This tree was acquired in 1998. The twisted trunk showed interesting structure. When I carefully studied for its development, I found that there were only two long roots.

I first planted this tree into a bonsai pot with bonsai soil without cutting the roots. I began the styling by shortening the long shoots and wiring a few branches”.



“In the Spring of 2000, the tree grew a lot of new roots, I could then repot it into a final Tokaname pot.

This picture shows how the tree looks in November 2000.”
